Save our Souls (SOS)


Bery, Lucy and Chris have decided that they want to go home after their seafaring adventures. But they have no map or compass, and they don't know where they are on the ocean.

Today's Arena team name is the Mary Rose. This ship was built between 1509 and 1511 for Henry VIII. It was one of the most powerful warships of its day. But when it set sail for the first time in 1545 after a major refit, it tipped over and sank. In 1982 what remained of it was lifted from the mud off Portsmouth.
