Tales of The Arena Ships



SS Great Britain: launched in 1843

One of the Arena teams is named after the SS Great Britain. When the famous engineer Isambard Kingdom Brunel built this ship in 1843, it was twice the size of any other ship. It could use both steam and sail. The great ship sailed across to America and to Australia for many years with people who were leaving Britain to live in those countries. In 1970 it was brought back to Bristol where it was restored. Today you can go on board the SS Great Britain in Bristol docks.
