What's in a Name?



The fish restaurant in the drama was given its name because it belongs to a man called Peter (or Pietro) – and the word Peter means "rock" in some languages. Rocky's Plaice is a double joke – because "Plaice/Place" has two meanings depending on how you spell it. The two words sound the same but mean different things.

Alongside the drama we are telling the Bible story of Peter. When he was born, Peter was called Simon and he worked as a fisherman. But Jesus changed his name to "Peter" because Jesus said Peter was like a rock. Every time he heard his new name, Peter was reminded that Jesus thought he was like a rock. Peter always did his best to help Jesus while he was alive. After Jesus ascended to heaven, Peter told other people about Jesus.
