Alma Cottage, 5 Albert Road (off Park Road), Dick & Gilly Hughes

A walled garden, first laid out in 1854 by the owner, a gardener from Chiswick. Some of the original layout has been retained, currently planted with fruit trees, grapevines and shrubs. There is an air raid shelter, a pirate's castle for supervised 4-7 year olds and a pond. Some local maps will be on display.

11 Clarence Road (off Park Road), Sian & Shaun Cove

Since the start of this year, both front and back gardens have been transformed with new fencing, patio, raised beds and a new lawn providing the structure for a contemporary take on a cottage garden.
